Reading

As readers we will be reading a variety of texts to support our fluency skills. Some texts will include non-fiction and poetry in preparation for SATS. We will be improving our reading skills using decoding, explaining, retrieving and interpreting the text. Please listen to your child read and record their home reading in their Reading Record. Whole class reading lessons will be based on a range of quality texts and excerpts.

Writing

As writers, we will be exploring writing which will allow the children to have experience days and discussions around a genre. Our narrative texts will be 'A Monster Calls' and 'Paperman', our non-fiction will be a non-chronological report on 'Everest'. In our writing we will be encouraging the children to upskill their vocabulary, use a variety of grammar and refine the skills of editing and proofreading.

Maths

As mathematicians, we will continue to explore the four operations to improve our fluency as well as fractions, measurement (angles) and statistics. Later in the term we will be looking at geometry: properties of shape/ position and direction.



RE

In R.E. this term, we will consider the following big questions:
How can following God bring freedom and justice?
Does faith help people in Cornwall when life gets hard?
 We will also be looking at data analysis and Sikhs in the UK today. Our continuation of learning on the Christian faith runs through every lesson, allowing us to compare and consider differing beliefs and traditions. Our core Christian values are COMPASSION and COURAGE this term so we will be learning more about living our values.

PSHE

In PSHE, we will learn about how to keep ourselves safe on and offline. We will also have our 'Growing and changing' unit of learning exploring puberty and healthy relationships, using SCARF resources.

As geographers, we will learn and explore climate zones and biomes, studying vegetation belts and the part they play in our world.

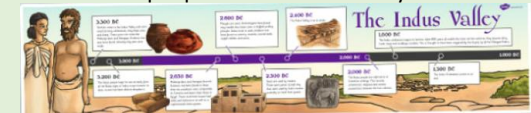


Science

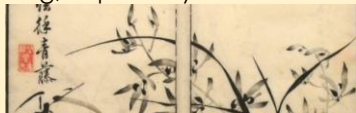
History
