

## Reading

We are teaching Reading through routines such as partner reading and 'My turn, Your turn' to model reading fluently.

Most children are now off the Read Write Inc phonics programme and all are accessing whole class reading this term. In our Whole class reading sessions, we will study 'The Iron Man' and then some shorter text excerpts to build fluency and comprehension.

**Reading at home daily to an adult will help your child to excel in all areas of school life.**

## Writing

As writers, we are developing our skills correcting our sentences with capital letters, correct punctuation and using powerful language. We will be basing our writing on an instructional text 'My Strong Mind' (a story about developing mental strength) and then diary writing based on 'The Diary of a London Rat.'



## Maths

As mathematicians we will develop our understanding of:

- Geometry - shape 2D and 3D
- Fractions - furthering our knowledge in Y2 and Y3
- Statistics - handling data and reading tables
- We will also be consolidating our number facts, times tables and 4 operations.

Times tables practise at home is vital to gain fluency - there are great games here <https://www.timestables.co.uk/>



## RE

In RE, we will be looking into the big questions:

1. For Christians, what was the impact of **Pentecost**?
2. How should we **care for the world** and for others, and why does it matter?

To learn about world views, we will be looking at how people flourish together. How can we develop spiritually to be able to understand others and our place in the world?

## PSHE

In Personal, Spiritual and Health development, we are focussing on **KEEPING SAFE** and **GROWING AND CHANGING**. ## PE

## Science

In Science, we will explore 'How does your garden grow?' looking closely at the parts of a plant, making comparisons, finding patterns and drawing conclusions. We will be using scientific terminology and learn key vocabulary that will help us to understand the biology of plants and flowers. Finally, we will be learning about the function of leaves and how seeds are dispersed.

## Geography

As Geographers, we will be comparing the physical and human features of the UK and Italy. We will be learning about differences and similarities across different countries and cultures.

## History

As Historians, we will study the Roman Empire, looking at government, changes in time and the legacy they have left on our modern world.

## Computing

In Computing, we will be learning how to create media through developing basic skills in desktop publishing using chromebooks. We will also be learning to programme, following on from our learning in the Spring.

## French

We will continue our languages journey with mealtimes, learning about café conversation and using our language skills to ask and answer questions.

## Art/ Design Technology

As artists, we will create a sculpture outdoors in our introduction to this medium using natural materials. In DT lessons, we will be making Summer seasonal tarts in a cooking unit of learning.
